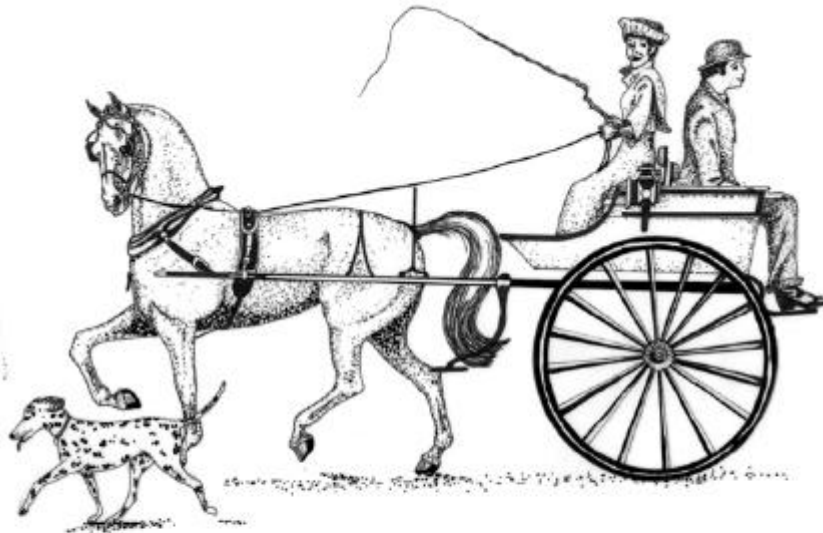

General Rules and Regulations

1. The Pleasure Days Carriage Driving Show is recognized by the American Driving Society and every class offered herein which is covered by the current rules and specification of the Society will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. Some exceptions are being made in the Marathon Vehicle Division. See Marathon Vehicle Division description for expected turnout in this division. Tejon Ranch Pleasure Drive is not an ADS recognized class. See Tejon Ranch Pleasure Drive class description for house rules

2. Entries

- The show committee reserves the right to decline any entry and/or return any entry fee at any time before or during the competition without being liable for any compensation.
- The Entry Fee is \$15.00 per class (except for class #61 which is free to those entries that qualify).
- Junior Entry Fees to be \$5.00 per class.
- Post Entries will be allowed. The Post Entry Fee per class is \$25.00.
- Entry fees are not refundable after the closing date. Partial refunds may be considered with a veterinary or medical certificate. Submit a written request for a refund. A \$25.00 office fee may be charged for any scratched entry.
- An entry is defined as a combination of horse(s), vehicle and driver. A change in any part of the combination constitutes a different turnout and must be assigned a separate entry number.
- Adding or scratching classes must be done at the show office at least two classes prior to the class being added or scratched.
- No award will be given any competitor participating in any class while displaying the incorrect number for that turnout.
- All drivers shall be members of the American Driving Society or pay a \$30.00 non-member fee, which **DOES NOT PROVIDE INSURANCE COVERAGE. All drivers must send copies of their current ADS membership card with their entries. More information at:**

3. Stabling and Camping

- Stabling is a combination of box stalls and pipe corrals (paddocks). Stabling is limited. Early entries will be given preference for stabling. Competitors may bring their own stabling if it is strong and suitable for their animals. The management will have final authority on the suitability of all competitor provided stabling. Box stalls are \$100.00 and pipe corrals are \$75.00.
- Stabling opens Thursday, May 31, 2012. Tack Stalls are not available.
- Stall fees are refundable until closing date, but not after.
- A wash rack will be provided for your convenience.
- All manure will be deposited in designated areas.
- There is a day use fee of \$50.00 per day PER COMPETITOR for those trailering in and out but not using stalls.
- Camping (no hook ups) on site is available, contact organizer for details.

4. Equines

- Animals must be sound and in good health. Out-of-state horses must include a negative Coggins test result and current health certificate along with their entry.
- Horses and ponies must be at least 3 years old.
- Draft horses will be allowed in divisions suitable for horses, but chain traces are not allowed. Vehicles for draft horses must be suitable for Carriage pleasure driving.
- Stallions may not be shown by junior or novice drivers.

5. Facility

- The main arena is a large fenced outdoor arena with sand footing. Marathon classes and Cross Country classes will be held on dirt roads and paved roads around the event site. Warm-up is available on dirt roads.
- No motorized vehicles will be allowed on the courses. Those with physical disabilities should contact show management in advance to arrange for special needs. All areas are within close proximity.
- **No smoking is allowed near any buildings or brush areas.** Please respect the property of our host.

6. Competitor Information

- Secretary's office opens at Noon Friday, June 1, 2012, @ 2 PM.
- A course diagram and applicable time allowed will be posted at least two hours before the start of the class.
- Courses may be walked by competitors up until 9:00 A.M. each day and during the lunch break, when the courses will not be in use. There will not be any official course walks.
- A driver's meeting will be held Saturday and Sunday mornings at 7:30 A.M. sharp for the clarification of any questions you may have about the show. Meet at the Official Notice Board near the office.
- Ring classes and obstacle classes will be run simultaneously. Ring classes will have precedence. No gate holds will be allowed because a competitor is in an obstacle class.
- The Show Committee reserves the right to combine or divide classes, or divisions, if the number of entries should warrant.
- Awards offered: Ribbons for 1st through 5th in each class with awards to 1st.
- Each individual driver is responsible for the safety of his or her turnout and the appropriate training of his or her animals. Horses, ponies, and VSE that are flighty, nervous or otherwise unsafe in congested areas should not attend this show.
- All competitors are subject to a safety check by show officials at any time for the purpose of ensuring the safety of all involved.
- Bridles should be adjusted to fit snugly to prevent catching on a vehicle or other pieces of harness. A bridle with a rein attached and passed through the saddle terrets must be in place whenever a horse is put to a vehicle. Failure to comply will incur elimination.
- The horse must never be left unattended while put to a vehicle. The driver or a competent adult must be holding the reins at all times when the driver is not in the vehicle. Failure to comply will incur elimination.
- No equine of any size may be led or ground driven with the vehicle attached.

7. Junior Drivers

- The "competition age" of an individual will be the age reached during the current calendar year.
- Junior Drivers under age 14 must be accompanied by a knowledgeable adult horseman at all times.
- Junior Drivers under age 11 may not compete in any classes held outside a securely enclosed arena and must be accompanied by a knowledge adult horseman at all times.
- All Juniors in all competitions must wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds current ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carry the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. Failure to comply will result in elimination (Chapter 5 Article 5.11).

8. Dogs will be welcomed at this show if they are "good citizens." Others will be asked to leave or be confined. Please clean up after your dogs. Dogs, when not in carriages, must be on a leash at all times or a penalty of \$25.00 will be incurred. **THIS RULE AND FINE WILL BE ENFORCED AT THE SHOW.** Dogs belonging to the ranch may be present and show management may not be able to enforce this rule on them. This is a working ranch and ranch live stock may be present.

9. Any question or condition not covered in this general information will be answered as it arises based on what is best for the show management and property owner.

- Spares and appointments must be carried on each vehicle during a pleasure drive.
- To be judged per ADS rules.

- Purpose: To test the driver on his skill in negotiating a cross country marathon at a prescribed pace.
- Marathon Course: The course will be over a combination of dirt and sand trail around a ranch pasture. Some bumps and dips will be encountered.
- Spares and appointments must be carried on each vehicle during a pleasure drive.
- To be judged per ADS rules.

Class 49: Single Horse

Class 52: Tandem and Four-In-Hand

Class 53: Marathon Vehicle

- Purpose: To allow the driver to compete against ideal time over a course of natural beauty.
- This class is restricted to experienced drivers and equines only.
- Recommended for marathon and low profile vehicles.
- Course Terrain: Rough, steep hills, may encounter livestock, deer, wild hogs and other animals.
- Course will be approximately 6 kilometers long.
- Spares and appointments carried will be at the discretion of the driver.
- The course is any pace except for the last 300 meters which is mandatory walk.
- Stopping, deviation from course or break in gate in the mandatory walk section will incur a 5 second penalty for each occurrence.
- Course distance and allowed time will be posted.
- Competitor actual course time plus or minus walk section penalties will determine class placing.
Competitors who finish under the time allowed will have walk section penalties subtracted from actual time. Competitors who finish over the allowed time will have walk section penalties added to actual time.
- Apron/knee rug and coat or jacket is optional.

Antique Vehicle Turnout Class

Class 64: Open to all who wish to enter their antique vehicle, not a reproduction or modern vehicle

- A pleasure driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the quality of each turnout.
- To be judged per ADS rules, with the following exceptions
 1. 75% on Vehicle and appropriateness of harness, neatness of attire and overall impression
 2. 25% on condition of Vehicle and harness.
 3. Vehicle and harness may be inspected to ensure thoughtful restoration and careful maintenance
 4. Period Costumes are definitely prohibited
 5. Performance will not be judged unless it detracts from the overall impression
 6. To be shown both ways of the arena at a walk, slow trot and working trot
 7. To stand quietly and to rein back

Division Championships

Division Grand Champions and Division Reserve Grand Champions will be based on points earned by entries in qualifying classes. First Place – 7 Points; Second Place – 5 Points; Third Place – 3 Points; Fourth Place – 2 Points; Fifth Place – 1 Point. Ties for any of the championships will be broken by the highest placing entry in the Reinsmanship class. An entry is defined as a combination of horse(s), vehicle and driver. A change in any part of the combination constitutes a different turnout and must be assigned a separate entry number.

Marathon Vehicle Division will have their own Champion and Reserve Champion awards but will not be eligible for the Over All Grand Championship award and therefore will not be returning for class #55.

Single Horse Division

Classes in this division are #[1], #[9], #17, #[25], #[33], #41 #49 and #54

For single horses and mules standing over 14.2 hands and at least 3 years of age. A registered horse of a breed permitting horses to be 14.2 or under (i.e. Arabian, Morgan, Quarter horse, etc.) may show as a horse, but not as a horse and a pony at the same show. Carriages must be an antique pleasure vehicle, an antique reproduction pleasure vehicle or a modern design pleasure vehicle. Division Championship qualifying classes are #1, #9, #25 and #33.

Single Pony Division

Classes in this division are #[2], #[10], #18 #[26], #[34], #42, #50 and #55

For single equines (ponies and mules) over 12.2 hands (50”) and not over 14.2 hands (58”) in height and at least 3 years of age. A registered animal of a breed permitting horses to be 14.2 or under (i.e. Arabian, Morgan, Quarter horse, etc.) may show as a pony, but not also as a horse at the same show. Carriages must be an antique pleasure vehicle, an antique reproduction pleasure vehicle or a modern design pleasure vehicle. Division Championship qualifying classes are #2, #10, #26 and #34.

Pair Horse and Pair Pony Division

Classes in this division are #[3], #[11], #19, #[27], #[35], #43, #51 and #56

For two equines of any height harnessed side-by-side. Animals must be at least 3 years of age. All pair entries must be driven to a four wheel vehicle except a Curricule or Cape Cart with appropriate harness. Pair entries must carry one groom. Carriages must be an antique pleasure vehicle, an antique reproduction pleasure vehicles or a modern design pleasure vehicle. Division Championship qualifying classes are #3, #11, #27 and #35.

Tandem and Four-in-Hand Division

Classes in this division are #[4], #[12], #20, #[28], #[36], #44, #52 and #57

For two, three or four equines of any height configured as a tandem, four-in-hand, or unicorn. Tandem entries must carry one groom. Four-in-hand and unicorn entries must carry two grooms. Division Championship qualifying classes are #4, #12, #28 and #36.

Junior Driver Division

Classes in this division are #[8], #[16], #24, #[32], #[40], #48 and #61

A Junior Driver is anyone 18 years and younger. The ‘competition age’ of an individual will be the age reached during the current calendar year. See General Rules and Regulations, Article 2.7 for additional information regarding Jr. Drivers.

Division Championship qualifying classes are #8, #16, #32 and #40

Novice Driver Division

Classes in this division are #[6], #[14], #22, #[30], #[38], #46 and #59

For drivers who have not yet won three blue ribbons in ADS or USEF recognized driving competition. Novice Drivers are prohibited from driving stallions (Chapter 18 Article 14.2). Division Championship qualifying classes are #6, #14, #30 and #38.

Very Small Equines (VSE) - MINI Division

Classes in this division are #[5], #[13], #21, #[29], #[37], #45 and #58

For single or pair entries of equines not over 12.2 hands (50”) in height and at least 3 years of age. Division Championship qualifying classes are #5, #13, #29 and #37.

Marathon Vehicle Division

Classes are #[7], #[15], #23, #[31], #[39], #47, #53 and #60

For single or pair entries of horses, ponies or mules being driven to vehicles commonly used for Combined Driving Marathon. Appropriate attire would be as for a Combined Diving Marathon for competitor and required navigator. Drivers under the age of 14 must be accompanied by a knowledgeable adult horseman, capable of rendering assistance in an emergency. Navigators may ride on more than one turnout during this show. Navigators must be at least 14 years old. ‘Shorts’ are not permitted. Required equipment includes helmets for driver and navigator and sturdy shoes or boots. Appropriate attire consists of matching shirts, which are colorful, or distinctive and matching pants. Gloves are optional for driver and navigator and a lap robe is not appropriate. Suggested appointments include protective vests and whatever equipment one would use on Marathon, such as clocks, protective boots, mud tails, green card in a holder, spare whip, etc. At this show, Navigators offering outside assistance in any class other than a marathon class will incur elimination for the entry. Navigators touching the ground with both feet will entail a penalty, except in the line-up where they may head the turnout. Metal vehicles without a back step are not considered marathon vehicles for the purposes of this show. Division Championship qualifying classes are #7, #15, #31, and #39.

Class 62: Division Grand Championship Drive Off

- Open to Division Grand Champions only with the exclusion of the Marathon Vehicle Division.
- To be shown both ways of the arena. Entries should stand quietly in the line up. To be judged 50% on overall impression and 50% on way of going
- Champions must show in the Championship Drive Off (class #55) to be eligible for Pleasure Days Grand Champion and Pleasure Days Reserve Grand Champion. At the conclusion of this ceremonial class the division championships will be awarded along with a Grand Championship and Reserve Grand Championship. The reserve division champions are invited to come and receive their awards without their turnouts.
